Chairman's Report 2021 Annual Report

The 2021 season, not too dissimilar to 2020, was heavily impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. The whole of New Zealand spent the majority of the back half of the season with some sort of restrictions in place disrupting their ability to operate at full capacity.

Auckland Table Tennis Association ("the Association"), like a number of other district associations in the Auckland region, spent a significant amount of time in a state of lockdown in Alert Levels 3 and 4 which ultimately meant the Auckland table tennis stadium was closed and we were unable to open our doors. While this was undoubtably disappointing for all our stadium keyholder members, players, officials, and administrators the lockdown was set down by the NZ Government in order to protect the health of all New Zealanders. The financial impact of the lockdown is not witnessed in the Financial Accounts contained within this Annual Report because the lockdown began on 17th August 2021 and the Association's Financial Year ended on 31st August 2021.

The length of the lockdowns saw a number of table tennis events and tournaments throughout the country postponed, or cancelled altogether, which was heart-breaking for all the players who had been working and training so hard in order to achieve their goals.

Unfortunate for the Association was that the COVID-19 pandemic resurfaced with the country going into lockdown a week before The Victor 2021 Auckland Open – the Association's flagship event. Preparations were well underway with 255 entries received for the event and major sponsors on board. While the Association is still planning to hold the event at some date in 2021, at the time of writing it is unknown when Auckland will move to an Alert Level where we could feasibly hold the event and emulate the success of previous years.

On a positive note, prior to the lockdown the Association was able to run a number of competitions and events. A record number of entries were received for the 2021 ANZAC Open, 2021 Auckland Junior Open, and the 2021 Auckland Max-Play Tournament. Throughout the 2021 season the Association experienced strong growth in areas such as stadium keyholder membership, Interclub team entries, and School Holiday Coaching programme revenue.

The Tables in Communities project continues to gain interest and support from outside agencies, funders, and other sporting codes. The number of partnerships developed, and the number of opportunities to participate in table tennis within the Auckland region, have grown markedly during the 2021 season which bodes well for the ongoing success of the project. Table tennis tables have been placed in indoor and outdoor table sites to allow access at all times of day. There are currently 58 table sites listed on the free Seekapong app. The table sites host 157 table tennis tables for community use (some sites host more than one table tennis table). Seekapong links players with table tennis tables in public spaces and places, and with fellow members of the table tennis community who share an interest in table tennis. The Seekapong app currently has 2,037 user registrations and the number of registrations grows weekly. The Association has a goal of 15,000 user registrations on Seekapong. Progress has been hampered primarily due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic however the Association continues to strive towards the goal.

Likewise, the numbers in the grassroots and school coaching programmes delivered by Eberhard Kleiser and Dinyar Irani have grown considerably. Revenue from the 2021 April

School Holiday Coaching programme was the highest since the School Holiday Coaching programme began.

The Association is committed to improving the quality of our extensive development coaching programme. The Association continues to invest heavily into our coaching programmes and to create pathways for its players and coaches to develop and grow. The number of coaches and training partners contracted to assist with delivery continues to increase and the Association is grateful for their support and input. In particular, I acknowledge the dedication and hard work of the Auckland coaching team spearheaded by Head Coach Wei Zhong Jiang, and assisted by Hyo Joo Lee, Dinyar Irani, Roger Wang, Eberhard Kleiser, Hea Youn Choi, Yuchong Zhou, and Patrick Low.

The Auckland representative squad coaching programme run by Head Coach Wei Zhong Jiang continues to grow in numbers. Competition is fierce to fill the available places in the Auckland representative training squads. Internal qualification tournaments are utilised to allow players to move up and down the training squad tiers (Junior Club Small Group, Intermediate B Squad, Intermediate A Squad, and Elite Squad). Qualification tournaments also double as a vehicle to assist in selecting Auckland representative teams. Two qualification tournaments were held throughout the year which created an exciting competitive atmosphere within the wider group.

The 2020 Winter Interclub competition was completed just prior to Christmas 2020 due to delays caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. This meant that the 2021 Summer Interclub competition began in January 2021 (as opposed to October of the previous year). The 2021 Summer Interclub competition was completed however the 2021 Winter Interclub competition was only into its second round when COVID-19 struck subsequently postponing the continuation of the competition until further notice.

Despite the lockdowns, the Association delivered the majority of its tournament calendar including the 2021 Auckland Summer Open, 2021 ANZAC Open, 2021 Auckland Max-Play Tournament, and the 2021 Auckland Junior Open. Auckland players continued to perform well in tournaments that were held domestically.

There were no opportunities for our top-level players to compete internationally during the 2021 season. The 2021 New Zealand Open Table Tennis Championships were originally scheduled to be held in October, postponed to November, and finally cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This was heart-breaking for players, coaches, managers, and particularly Table Tennis Canterbury who had spent significant time preparing and planning to host the event.

The Association adjusted the criteria for the 2021 Commute Transportation Consultants ATTA Elite Player Scholarships several times during the season. This was due to the cancellation of the 2021 Oceania Championships, the postponement of the 2021 Auckland Open, and the cancellation of the 2021 NZ Open Table Tennis Championships. As a result, at the time of writing the Scholarships have not been awarded. Scholarship recipients for the 2021 season will be decided in the coming months. Nathan Xu was awarded the Errol Cheal Memorial Trophy for the 2021 Auckland Player of the Year for his performances winning the 2021 Auckland Summer Open Men's singles title, 2021 ANZAC Open Men's singles title, and the 2021 North Shore Open Men's singles title.

Due to increased demand for table tennis in the Auckland region, the Association made the important decision to expand staffing and welcomed Hongbing (Peter) Wu to the role of Stadium Administrator in late April 2021. Peter has been a long-time supporter and contributor to the Association and has already made a significant difference to our team

within the short period he has been employed, particularly in promoting stadium keyholder memberships and generating event sponsorship.

As always, the Association is eternally grateful for contributions from Gaming Societies, Community Trusts, Local Boards, and Sport Auckland who have been very supportive of our programmes during the 2021 season. Special mention must go to Cliff Freeman (Funding Officer) who continued to shine for the Association in obtaining funding for our many projects. The Association acknowledges the support of Blue Sky Community Trust, Blue Waters Community Trust, Dragon Community Trust, Foundation North, Four Winds Foundation, Grassroots Trust, Milestone Foundation, Mt. Wellington Foundation Ltd., NZCT, Pub Charity Limited, Rano Community Trust, TAB NZ, The Lion Foundation, The Trusts Community Foundation, and Trillian Trust who approved grants to the Association in a year when the funding sector also faced significant challenges and uncertainty due to the COVID-19 pandemic. We are grateful to Albert-Eden Local Board, Howick Local Board, Maungakiekie-Tamaki Local Board, and Orakei Local Board for their support during the past financial year. We are pleased to have received District Association Development Investment from Table Tennis New Zealand, and Tu Manawa Active Aotearoa funding support from Sport Auckland.

To our family of sponsors, a big thank you for continuing to support the Association in these challenging times. Sponsors included; Commute Transportation Consultants, Penberthy Insurance, Ray White Real Estate, Anran International (NZ) Limited, PRIZM Group, The Gateau House, and UNO Property Management. Product sponsorship was received from Rialto Cinemas, Domino's Pizza, and Coca-Cola.

The Association received support from the Ministry of Social Development in the form of Wage Subsidies, and support from the Inland Revenue Department in the form of Resurgence Support Payments due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.

On a sad note, the Association farewelled one of its long-time stalwarts Jim Coad who passed away in August this year. Jim was a Life Member of the Association. Words cannot do justice to the contribution Jim made to the Association over many years. Jim will always be remembered fondly by members of the Management Committee, stadium keyholder members, and the wider Auckland table tennis community.

On behalf of the Association, I wish district associations and members of the table tennis community all the best for the festive season. I am hopeful that we can reopen our doors soon and get back to some semblance of normality growing the sport and providing more opportunities for people to play table tennis in Auckland.

2020 / 2021 Auckland Interclub competition

The Auckland Interclub competition continued to offer the option for teams to play with either two players or three players in a team on any one given night. Players in two-player teams contested two singles matches and one doubles match each. In three-player teams one player contested two singles matches, and two players each contested one singles match and one doubles match. Two-player teams could compete against three-player teams. The preference was for grades to be comprised of six teams and to contest a full round robin over the course of each five-week round. The top six grades competed on Thursday nights and the lowest grades competed on Wednesday nights. The Auckland Interclub competition continued to be run with a promotion / relegation system being employed between all grades.

The 2020 Auckland Winter Interclub competition attracted entries from 66 teams that were placed into eleven grades (66 teams entered during the 2019 season). The competition began on 22nd July, 2020 and was scheduled to run for two rounds, finishing in late September 2020. However, the competition was put on hold due to the Auckland Alert Level 3 lockdown in August 2020 and The Players' Domestic Table Tennis Championships in early October 2020. The competition resumed in mid-October 2020 and concluded on 10th December, 2020 after 10 weeks of play.

The 2021 Auckland Summer Interclub competition attracted entries from 72 teams that were placed into twelve grades (60 teams entered during the 2019 / 2020 season). The competition was scheduled to run for three rounds. The first and second rounds of the competition were slightly lengthened due to short Auckland Alert Level 3 lockdowns in February 2021 and March 2021. The third round of the competition ran without interruption. The competition concluded on 3rd June 2021 after 15 weeks of play.

The 2021 Auckland Winter Interclub competition attracted entries from 76 teams that were placed into twelve grades (66 teams entered during the 2020 season). In order to cater for all teams the Association introduced two eight team grades — B1 Grade on Thursday night, and D1 Grade on Wednesday night. The eight team grades were split into two pools of four teams that each contested a full round robin with semi-final crossovers and a final to determine the final placings for promotion / relegation purposes. The competition began on 9th June, 2021 and was scheduled to run for three rounds finishing in late September 2021. However, the competition was put on hold due to the Auckland Alert Level 4 lockdown in August 2021. One round of competition was completed for inclusion in this Annual Report.

The Interclub Player of the Year Awards were decided by determining the player who accumulated the most singles and doubles wins irrespective of grade. Awards were presented for the 2020 Auckland Winter Interclub competition and the 2021 Auckland Summer Interclub competition respectively. Oscar Jiang was the winner of the Bill Burns Memorial Trophy for Winter Interclub Player of the Year. Carrie Guo was the winner of the Dick Rassie Memorial Trophy for Summer Interclub Player of the Year. Prizes were also awarded to the first placed teams in each grade after the final round of competition.

All Auckland junior representative players, and all Auckland senior representative players vying for selection in the Auckland Open Men's A team, Open Men's B team, Open Women's A team, and Open Women's B team were required to compete in at least 50% of Auckland Winter Interclub team contests. However, the New Zealand Open Table Tennis Championships were cancelled in the 2021 season.

Funding was received from Blue Waters Community Trust and NZCT as a contribution towards the contract fees of David Jackson (Competitions Manager) which included delivery of the Auckland Interclub competition.

2021 Auckland Interschools table tennis competition

The Auckland Table Tennis Association was responsible for collection and processing of entries for the Auckland Interschools table tennis competition Term One (Pre-season) competition. The competition attracted 54 entries, which was a large increase compared with the 36 entries received for the same competition in the 2020 season and continued a recent trend. All team contests for the Term One (Pre-season) competition were delivered from the Auckland table tennis stadium in one session that ran on Fridays from 3.45p.m. – 6.00p.m. The competition was revised to run for four weeks (as opposed to the usual six weeks) due to short Auckland Alert Level 3 lockdowns in February 2021 and March 2021 because of the COVID-19 pandemic. Certificates were awarded based on results after four weeks of play.

College Sport collected entries for the Auckland Interschools table tennis competition Term Two (Winter) and Term Three (Early Spring) competitions. Entries were collected via the EnterNow system and then forwarded to the Association following the close of entries. Two venues hosted the four sessions of the 2021 Auckland Interschools table tennis competition in Term Two (Winter) and Term Three (Early Spring):

- a) Central Auckland venue: Auckland table tennis stadium; Thursday 3.45p.m. -6.00p.m., Friday 3.45p.m. -6.00p.m., Friday 6.00p.m. -8.15p.m.
- b) East Auckland venue: St. Kentigern College sports hall, Friday 3.45p.m. 5.35p.m.

The Auckland Interschools table tennis competition Term Two (Winter) was played to completion. There were seven weeks of play. Certificates were awarded.

The Auckland Interschools table tennis competition Term Three (Early Spring) competition was discontinued after two weeks of play due to the Auckland Alert Level 3 and Alert Level 4 lockdown that began in August 2021 because of the COVID-19 pandemic. Certificates were awarded based on results after two weeks of play.

Entry numbers were as follows:

- a) 2021 Auckland Interschools table tennis competition Term One (Pre-season): 54 teams (from 36 teams in 2020), competition revised to run for four weeks due to the COVID-19 pandemic

2021 Auckland Primary & Intermediate Interschools table tennis team competition

The Auckland Table Tennis Association continued to deliver the Auckland Primary & Intermediate Interschools table tennis team competition that was first established during the 2016 season. 2020 Primary School Table Tennis Tournament

5th November 2020, Auckland

The eighth annual Primary School Table Tennis Tournament was hosted by the Auckland Table Tennis Association on Thursday 5th November, 2020. The Tournament was promoted and driven by Eberhard Kleiser (Development Coach).

Round robin groups of eight players were contested in the first stage of the tournament (where possible). The top two players from each round robin group progressed to the knockout round. Players not in the top two at the conclusion of their group had no further matches following the round robin stage. All matches in the round robin stage were played as one advantage game to 11 points. All matches in the knockout stage were played as the best of three games to 11 points.

One hundred and forty-nine entries (117 boys, 32 girls) were received from 22 primary schools. Numbers decreased from the 181 entries received from 26 primary schools in the 2019 season.

The Victor 2020 Auckland Open 6th – 8th November 2020, Auckland

The Auckland Open continued to be the premier event on the Auckland Table Tennis Association tournament calendar. Naming rights sponsorship was secured from The Victor for the 2020 event.

The Victor 2020 Auckland Open was originally scheduled to be contested in August 2020 however the tournament was affected by the COVID-19 pandemic and the resulting lockdowns. Therefore, the tournament was postponed to November 2020.

The Association received 197 entries from players affiliated to Auckland, Counties-Manukau, Manawatu, Northland, North Shore, Otago, and Waitemata. The COVID-19 pandemic resulted in less players being prepared to travel and congregate in large groups to participate in tournaments. There was a significant reduction in entry numbers as compared to the 2019 Auckland Open which hosted 252 players.

The Association continued to advertise, promote, build recognition, and raise awareness of the Auckland Open. Advertising continued to be conducted via e-mail, the Association website, Facebook, printed flyers, and word of mouth. The Open Finals session was held on the evening of Saturday 7th November, 2020. Over 181 spectators collected free tickets to enter the spot prize draws held during the Open Finals session. The number of spectators decreased significantly as compared with the 2019 Auckland Open which attracted over 300 spectators.

The Open event sponsors were; Penberthy Insurance, Commute Transportation Consultants, Ray White Real Estate – Parnell, UNO Property Management, and PRIZM DataTech. Coca-Cola donated merchandise. The Gateau House donated gift vouchers. Free food and soft drinks were distributed to spectators during the Open Finals session including Tip Top ice cream, confectionery donated by Jim Coad, and baked goods.

The Open Finals session began with the Open Men's doubles final, followed by the Open Women's singles final, and concluded with the Open Men's singles final. Only one final was in progress at any one time which enabled a centre court atmosphere to be created around a single table. Dinyar Irani was appointed as Open Finals session MC.

All players who lost in the second life draw, prior to the bronze medal match, played off for final positions in a progressive knockout with other players who lost at the same stage.

Spot prize draws were held on the day.

The event was mixed gender i.e. boys and girls were combined in the same draw and entries were only be accepted from players with 600 or less rating points on the Auckland Table Tennis Association rating list at the entry closing date.

Ninety-three entries were received for the event arising from Auckland, Bay of Plenty, Counties-Manukau, North Shore, Northland, Waikato, and Waitemata. There were two events held, an A Grade (30 players, 2 byes) and a B Grade (63 players, 1 bye).

Errol Cheal Memorial Trophy for Auckland Player of the Year

In 2007 the family of Errol Cheal donated a trophy to be presented to the Auckland Table Tennis Association Player of the Year. The trophy is presented in memory of Errol Cheal (1907 - 2005).

Errol started playing table tennis as an 11 year old on the kitchen table and kept competing until failing eyesight forced him to stop at the age of 88. Errol was a table tennis player, administrator, coach, and mentor, and achieved a number of milestones throughout his lifetime:

- 1934: First New Zealand Open Men's singles champion
- 1935: Secretary of the Auckland Table Tennis Association
- 1943 1959: Chairman of the Auckland Table Tennis Association
- 1949 1959: President of the Auckland Table Tennis Association
- 1951 1952: President of Table Tennis New Zealand
- 1954: Gold medal for winning the Over 45 Men's singles title at the New Zealand Veteran Table Tennis Championships
- 1970: Served the first ball at the opening of the Auckland table tennis stadium to Sir Dove Meyer Robinson
- 1987: Gold medal for winning the Over 70 Men's singles title at the New Zealand Veteran Table Tennis Championships
- 1990: First New Zealand table tennis player to become a World Champion in winning the Over 80 Men's doubles at the World Veteran Table Tennis Championships in Baltimore, USA. Placed third in the Over 80 Men's singles at the same Championships

Errol was a life member of the Auckland Table Tennis Association and Table Tennis New Zealand, and a member of the International Swaythling Table Tennis Club.

In 2021 the Errol Cheal Memorial Trophy was awarded to Nathan Xu. Nathan performed well in singles competition within New Zealand during the 2021 season. Nathan was runner-up in The Victor 2020 Auckland Open Men's singles. Nathan won the 2021 Auckland Summer Open Men's singles title, 2021 ANZAC Open Men's singles title, and the 2021 North Shore Open Men's singles title.

JIM COAD



10th August 1925 - 10th August 2021

Auckland Table Tennis Association:

Life Member (1986) President (2011-2012)

On a playing note, Jim Coad was a regular participant in Interclub. One interesting table tennis title Jim won was the Generation Doubles, with his son Trevor, at the Valley Kwok Family Tournament in 1982. In later years Jim enjoyed participating at Day Club.

Jim was an extremely dedicated volunteer. Jim joined the Association Management Committee in 1982. Jim took on the role of convenor of the Fundraising Committee at a time when the Auckland Table Tennis Association ("the Association") was rebuilding after an arsonist set fire to the Auckland table tennis stadium. Jim arranged garage sales, Las Vegas evenings, tote tickets, raffles, and Pingpongathons.

Jim's standout fundraising activity was Housie which he introduced at the Association beginning in 1984 and hosted weekly on Saturday evenings. Jim coordinated all aspects of the Housie evenings which quickly became the major fundraising activity for the Association. Jim spent 11 years' worth of Saturday evenings organizing and delivering Housie with his team of helpers, hardly having a weekend off during that time – an example of Jim's incredible qualities of reliability and dependability. Jim's wife Yvonne was often by his side preparing supper in the cafeteria, particularly in the early years. Housie evenings ended in October 1995 having generated a profit of over \$210,000 for the Association. To put that achievement in perspective, the average Auckland house price was only \$138,000 in 1995.

Jim was always looking for ways to contribute and to serve. Jim volunteered at the Hosting Inclusive Table Tennis special needs programme at the Association. Jim bought bananas for the students and volunteers to eat at morning tea. It became such a tradition that the volunteers affectionately named him "Banana Jim".

Jim ran social Drawn Doubles evenings for the Association. Drawn Doubles became a fixture on the Association calendar. The 2020 Christmas Drawn Doubles was the 49th edition. The Management Committee would receive a full breakdown of expenditure for Drawn Doubles after the event, meticulously typed out on Jim's typewriter. However, the most memorable part of Drawn Doubles evenings was the close Coad family bond. It started with Jim's wife Yvonne preparing supper in the cafeteria, and son Trevor playing. In recent years we saw Jim's daughters Alison and Sharon, and grandchildren Jasmine, Claire, and Ben all contribute to keeping the Drawn Doubles running.

Jim was elected a Life Member of the Association in 1986 and served as President of the Association in 2011 and 2012. Jim was still a member of the Management Committee in 2021 after 40 years of service.

The Management Committee, stadium keyholder members, and the Auckland table tennis community will miss Jim's presence around the Association. Jim was an icon, who was well respected, and cannot be replaced.

COVID-19 pandemic

The Auckland table tennis stadium was required to shut due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the ensuing short Auckland Alert Level 3 lockdowns in February 2021 and March 2021. The stadium re-opened under Alert Level 2 with access granted on a booking basis only. The Association committed to staffing the stadium from 10.00a.m. – 11.59p.m. during Alert Level 2 to allow players the best opportunity to get back to participating in table tennis. Clubs did not run during Alert Level 4 or Alert Level 3. The Association resumed development coaching groups in the Auckland table tennis stadium under Alert Level 2.0 with appropriate measures in place. The Association returned to normal activity at Alert Level 1 with continued hygiene precautions in place.

The Auckland table tennis stadium was required to shut due to the COVID-19 pandemic and a major Auckland Alert Level 3 and Alert Level 4 lockdown that began on 17th August 2021. The lockdown has not ended at the time of writing (late October 2021). The Association continues to monitor NZ Government guidance and make announcements as information comes to light. Delivery of sport and recreation will be required to change in the future, particularly for indoor sport and recreation providers.

During the lockdowns the Association kept in regular contact with the table tennis community through e-mail, website, Facebook, Instagram, and You Tube. The Association is in the process of creating an e-book for distribution to the table tennis community.

The Association received COVID-19 support from the Ministry of Social Development in the form of the wage subsidies and resurgence support payments. The Association applied for support from the Tamaki Makaurau Sector Support Fund in October 2021.

Club activities external to the Auckland table tennis stadium East Auckland Table Tennis Club:

Eberhard Kleiser continued to deliver the East Auckland Table Tennis Club at the Pakuranga Community Hall on Tuesday nights. The Pakuranga Community Hall was shut during COVID-19 Alert Level 3 and Alert Level 4. As a result, the East Auckland Table Tennis Club ran on 31 occasions during the period November 2020 – August 2021. There was an average attendance of 16 players per session.

Eastern Table Tennis Club:

Bob Inns coordinated the Eastern Table Tennis Club which ran on Monday nights in the St. Thomas' School Hall. The St. Thomas' School Hall was shut during COVID-19 Alert Level 3 and Alert Level 4. The Club offered free membership for all participants (students and seniors). Attendance numbers were strong. One team from the Eastern Table Tennis Club regularly competed in the Auckland Interclub competition.

Eberhard Kleiser began delivery of free development coaching to students at St. Thomas' School on Monday lunchtimes in March 2021. Attendance numbers were strong with an average of 27 students attending each development coaching session. St. Thomas' School students also received free entry into the Eastern Table Tennis Club. In return, the Eastern Table Tennis Club received free hall hire from St. Thomas' School.

French Bay Table Tennis Club:

Bryce Kay delivered the French Bay Table Tennis Club in the St. John Vianney Catholic Church Hall in Hillsborough on Tuesday nights. The Club ran from 30^{th} March 2021 until 10^{th} August 2021 before closing due to the COVID-19 pandemic and ensuing lockdowns. The Club intends to start 4 weeks earlier in the 2022 season due to lost playing time during the 2021 season. During the 2021 season the Club experienced reduced attendance numbers (an average of 5-6 players per night). The reduction in attendance numbers was primarily attributed to the disrupted 2021 season.

Tune Table Tennis Club:

Dinyar Irani (Tables in Communities Project Manager / Development Coach) continued to deliver Tune Table Tennis Club on Saturday afternoons which was first established in the 2019 season. The Club was based in the Pakuranga College School Hall in Pakuranga. Tune Table Tennis Club ran on 24 occasions during the 2021 season. A total of 122 players attended the Club during the 2021 season (79 players attended in the 2020 season).

In 2021, Tune Table Tennis Club saw an increase in the number of players who were interested in developing their game to become to competitive club level players, then to progress to become Auckland representative players. To cope with this demand, Tune Table Tennis ran two group coaching sessions on Saturday afternoons. The first group coaching session (Tune Table Tennis B Squad) ran from 2.00p.m. – 4.00p.m. and targeted younger children and beginners. An average of 18 players attended Tune Table Tennis B Squad each week. The second group coaching session (Tune Table Tennis A Squad) ran from 4.00p.m. – 6.30p.m. and targeted players aiming to become competitive club level players or Auckland representative players. An average of 14 players attended Tune Table Tennis A Squad each week.

The COVID-19 pandemic, local elections, and school productions affected availability of the Pakuranga College School Hall which led to irregular training opportunities for Tune Table Tennis Club members.

Tune Table Tennis Club acknowledged the support of the Auckland Table Tennis Association and Pakuranga College.

Waiheke Table Tennis Club:

Herve Mavre continued to deliver the Waiheke Table Tennis Club on Sunday afternoons which was first established in the 2019 season. The Club was based in the Onetangi Hall on Waiheke Island. The Club stopped all play in August 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic and ensuing lockdowns.

Club activities based at the Auckland table tennis stadium

<u>Central Club</u>: Continued to run on Monday evenings from 7.00p.m. – 10.00p.m. Eberhard Kleiser coordinated the Central Club which was run on a ladder system. Matches were played the best of one game to 11 points, and play was self-managed via a series of boards placed at the end of each table which allowed players to move their name tag up or down a table based on the result of their match. The Central Club was shut during COVID-19 Alert Level 3 and Alert Level 4. As a result, Central Club ran on 31 occasions during the period November 2020 – August 2021. Central Club attendance numbers were very strong with an average attendance of 47 players per session.

<u>Day Club</u>: The New Zealand Chinese Table Tennis Association (NZCTTA) delivered the Day Club on Mondays, Wednesdays, Saturdays, and Sundays from 9.30a.m. – 12.30p.m. The Day Club was shut during COVID-19 Alert Level 3 and Alert Level 4. The NZCTTA delivered a Team Tournament in November 2020, Open Individual Tournament in August 2021, and a Junior Individual Tournament in August 2021. The Association and the NZCTTA continued their partnership whereby stadium keyholder members' annual Day Club administration fee was covered by the Association for the 2021 season. It is intended for this partnership to continue in future seasons.

<u>Korean Club</u>: Continued to be delivered by Hyo Joo Lee and Richard Kang under the auspices of the Korean Table Tennis Association of New Zealand. The Club ran on Saturday nights from 6.00p.m. – 10.00p.m. The Korean Club was shut during COVID-19 Alert Level 3 and Alert Level 4. The Club was open to all players. Hyo Joo Lee and Hea Youn Choi delivered free coaching to attendees at the Club. The coaching was funded by the Association.

<u>University of Auckland Table Tennis Club</u>: Sophie Low succeeded George (Honggang) Zhang as President of the University of Auckland Table Tennis Club for the 2021 season. The Club ran on Sunday nights from 6.30p.m. – 9.30p.m. Attendance numbers were strong which placed pressure on table availability at various points in the season. The Club was shut during COVID-19 Alert Level 3 and Alert Level 4. The Club ran from March 2021 to August 2021.

Stadium keyholder memberships & table hire

The Association experienced strong growth in stadium keyholder membership numbers during the 2021 season. Directly prior to COVID-19 lockdown beginning on 17th August 2021 there were 412 paying stadium keyholder members – a record number. In addition, the Association had close to a full financial year of generating stadium keyholder membership revenue. As a result, revenue from stadium keyholder memberships increased markedly for the 2021 season as compared to the 2020 financial year which was significantly disrupted by COVID-19 lockdowns.

The majority of stadium keyholder members pay a lump sum membership fee in advance (306 members). The balance of stadium keyholder members pay a weekly membership fee via Debit Success (106 members). The Association has committed to extending stadium keyholder memberships by the period that Auckland is at COVID-19 Alert Level 3 and Alert Level 4. Therefore, the receipt of revenue from stadium keyholder memberships paid by lump sum will be delayed in the 2021 / 2022 financial year. The financial impact of the long Alert Level 3 and Alert Level 4 lockdown (beginning on 17th August 2021) on stadium keyholder memberships will be realised in the next financial year. Historically the majority of stadium keyholders have been quick to return to play whenever Auckland moves to Alert Level 2.5 or below.

Stadium keyholder members were entitled to free attendance at Central Club, Day Club (including the Day Club administration fee), Day Club U19 training, Girls Coaching, Junior Club, Interclub (excepting the team entry fee), and Korean Club. In addition, stadium keyholder members received a 15% reduction in entry fees when they entered Auckland regional tournaments and were eligible to enter a draw to win a free extension equal to the term of their current stadium keyholder membership at The Victor 2020 Auckland Open.

Revenue from stadium and table hire increased significantly as compared with the previous financial year due to the amount of time the Auckland table tennis stadium was required to be shut as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic during the 2020 season. The Auckland table tennis stadium was booked by organisations such as the Aotearoa Maori Table Tennis Association, Auckland Chinese Table Tennis Association, New Zealand Chinese Table Tennis Association, Table Tennis New Zealand, Summit Chess Club, and Manukau Institute of Technology. Tables were hired for coaching by school groups such as ACG Parnell College, Dilworth School, and St. Peter's College.

The Association Management Committee made a significant change to the way in which coach fees were administered from 1st March 2021. The Gold coach fee and the Standard coach fee were discontinued. Association registered coaches were charged a table fee of \$10.00 per hour while delivering coaching from Monday – Friday. Association registered coaches were charged a table fee of \$20.00 per hour while delivering coaching from Saturday – Sunday. Association registered coaches were invoiced for table fees on a fortnightly basis with 7-day payment terms. The change led to a significant revenue stream being created from coach table fees.

Stadium keyholders continued to actively arrange their own practice independent of Clubs and other organised play opportunities. This was key to allowing a quick return to play for stadium keyholders at Alert Level 2. The Association coordinated and managed bookings for players in the Auckland table tennis stadium at Alert Level 2 between the hours of 10.00a.m. – 11.59p.m.

The marked increase in stadium keyholder members using the Auckland table tennis stadium in conjunction with increased participation in Association development coaching, competitions, events, and casual play led to increased pressure on table availability. The Association worked to

address the issue by erecting additional tables at strategic times and instituting a coach booking system. However, long-term there is a shortage of table tennis courts which must be addressed.

Facilities Development Projects

a) Facilities Development Project 1: The Association, in conjunction with the Auckland Badminton Association, recognise that facility space is a major constraint in meeting the demand for table tennis and badminton in the Auckland community. Auckland Council has acknowledged that there is a shortage of indoor court space in the greater Auckland region. Both table tennis and badminton have large demand and participation rates, especially amongst junior players, and rate well amongst the increasingly diverse Auckland community. The Association is partnering with Auckland Badminton Association and Olympic Weightlifting Auckland to pursue funding for the staged redevelopment of the existing Gillies Avenue site through the Auckland Council Sport & Recreation Facilities Investment Fund. The key strategy to meet demand is to develop the Gillies Avenue site that will then serve as the regional facility for table tennis and badminton in Auckland. Stage 1 is creating a building with under-croft parking to bridge the carpark between the existing Auckland table tennis stadium and Badminton Hall and create additional court space that would be shared by table tennis and badminton as demand necessitated. Olympic Weightlifting Auckland would be housed within the new development.

b) Facilities Development Project 2: the Association is a founding member of the Lloyd Elsmore Community Hub. The purpose of the Hub is to construct a multi-club and code facility at Lloyd Elsmore Park to accommodate the four Founding Members (Auckland Table Tennis Association, Howick Gymnastics Club, Pakuranga Bowling Club, and Pakuranga Tennis Club). The Hub will reflect the values and principles of member organisations and will embrace and encourage community use of the Hub for sport and other recreation activities. The Hub is engaging with Howick Local Board, Auckland Council, and Sport Auckland.

Drawn Doubles

Jim Coad and his family delivered a Drawn Doubles evening in conjunction with the 2020 Winter Interclub prizegiving. The Drawn Doubles was the Association's end of year social function and was held on 26th November 2020. The Drawn Doubles attracted 64 entries (there were 60 entrants in the 2019 season).

Jim Coad passed away on 10th August, 2021. The Association plans to continue holding Drawn Doubles evenings in memory of Jim and his amazing contribution to the Association over an extended period of time. Drawn Doubles evenings will be held during November each year (when possible), and will be held in conjunction with Winter Interclub prizegiving. The date of the 2021 Drawn Doubles and Winter Interclub prizegiving will likely be delayed due to the COVID-19 pandemic and ensuing lockdowns.

Development Coaching

The 2021 season was the fifth full season that Eberhard Kleiser was employed by the Association. Key aspects of Eberhard's role were as follows:

- a) delivered school development programmes and promotions at community facilities across Central and East Auckland. Eberhard delivered 184 development sessions to 4,040 students from November 2020 August 2021 and used his many development sessions to promote Association tournaments, competitions, and events
- b) delivered development coaching in the Auckland table tennis stadium within the Association player development pathway including Day Club U19 training, Junior Club, School Holiday Coaching programmes, and the Young Explorers programme
- c) Club coordinator for Central Club, East Auckland Table Tennis Club, and Somerville after-school club. Eberhard also coordinated and delivered the HITT special needs programme d) promoted and delivered the Primary & Intermediate team competition which incorporated venues in both Central Auckland and East Auckland and ran in Term 4 of the 2020 season, Term 2 of the 2021 season, and Term 3 of the 2021 season

e) promoted Auckland regional tournaments and assisted with delivery. Eberhard also promoted and assisted with delivery of the 2020 Primary School Tournament, the 2021 Central Zone Intermediate table tennis tournament, and the 2021 South-Eastern Zone table tennis tournament f) delivered Tables in Communities project activations at the Auckland table tennis stadium and community venues

Funding was received for Eberhard Kleiser's (Development Coach) role from Blue Waters Community Trust, Four Winds Foundation, Howick Local Board, NZCT, Mt. Wellington Foundation, Orakei Local Board, Pub Charity Limited, The Trusts Community Foundation, and Tu Manawa Active o Aotearoa.

The Central Auckland school development programme continued during the 2021 season. The programme targeted six intermediate schools in close proximity to the Auckland table tennis stadium; Auckland Normal Intermediate, Kowhai Intermediate, Mt. Roskill Intermediate, Pasadena Intermediate, Ponsonby Intermediate, and Remuera Intermediate. School demonstrations were delivered at Mt. Roskill Intermediate, Pasadena Intermediate, and Ponsonby Intermediate. Demonstrations were conducted by Wei Zhong Jiang, Dean Shu, and Dinyar Irani, with Shane Warbrooke providing commentary.

Development coaching was delivered to students from each intermediate school free of charge. Auckland Normal Intermediate and Remuera Intermediate students received coaching at the Auckland table tennis stadium during Term One. Kowhai Intermediate, Mt. Roskill Intermediate, and Pasadena Intermediate students received coaching at their respective schools during Term 1. Ponsonby Intermediate students received coaching at their school during Term 1 and Term 2. Dinyar Irani, Eberhard Kleiser, and Shane Warbrooke delivered development coaching sessions. Students were offered the opportunity to enter the 2021 Central Auckland Primary & Intermediate table tennis team competition to continue their table tennis experience.

Funding was received for Shane Warbrooke's (CEO / Development Officer) role from Blue Sky Community Trust, Four Winds Foundation, NZCT, Rano Community Trust, and The Trusts Community Foundation.

Patrick Low assisted the Association in delivering development and coaching programmes in schools, particularly in East Auckland. Patrick delivered school coaching and development activities in Bucklands Beach Intermediate, Farm Cove Intermediate, Mission Heights Junior College, St. Kentigern Boys' School, St. Kentigern College, and Wakaaranga Primary School. Students were offered the opportunity to enter the 2021 East Auckland Primary & Intermediate table tennis team competition to continue their table tennis experience and Patrick coordinated the competition. Patrick delivered an after-school club at Farm Cove Intermediate on Friday afternoons during the school term.

Patrick Low delivered the ATTA Intermediate East Auckland Development Squad in Term 4 of the 2020 season. The ATTA Intermediate East Auckland Development Squad did not run in Term 4 of the 2021 season due to the COVID-19 pandemic and ensuing lockdowns.

Dinyar Irani delivered regular development coaching sessions to schools including ACG Parnell College, Glendowie College, and Pakuranga College.

Tables in Communities project

The Association undertook the Tables in Communities project (Year 3) with the vision to link table tennis resource with technology in conjunction with a comprehensive development programme. Dinyar Irani was employed as Tables in Communities Project Manager.

The Tables in Communities project is growing junior and community participation by putting table tennis tables into community indoor and outdoor spaces, supporting those tables with localised programmes, and building a new network of playing communities at multiple sites across Auckland. The project includes an innovative approach that uses technology to link players with table tennis tables in public spaces and places and with fellow members of the table tennis community.

The Association promoted the free Tables in Communities app – Seekapong – which shows people where to access table tennis within their community and links people with each other through the sport of table tennis, thus forming an interactive table tennis community. Table sites are listed on the free Seekapong app. Seekapong links players with table tennis tables in public spaces and places, and with fellow members of the table tennis community who share an interest in table tennis. Engagement with the table tennis community is ever increasing. The Seekapong app currently has 2,037 user registrations and the number of registrations grows weekly. The Association finalized trademark registration of "Seekapong" in New Zealand and Australia in April 2021. The Association finalized Phase 2.1 development of Seekapong to enable the Association to distribute the app wider than the Auckland region in August 2021.

Table tennis tables have been placed at indoor and outdoor table sites to allow access at all times of day. New table sites have been established, and partnerships have been formed with existing table sites. There are currently 58 table sites listed on the free Seekapong app. The table sites host 157 table tennis tables for community use (some sites host more than one table tennis table). The number of table sites spread throughout the community has reduced transport as a barrier to participation.

Table tennis tables, bats, and balls were placed in community spaces and places and made available to the general public free of charge, or at very low cost. 41 of the table tennis table sites are free to participate at, and a further 6 of the table sites cost \$5.00 or less to participate, thereby removing cost as a barrier to participation.

The Association engaged with community groups, Clubs, Marae, recreation centres, schools, libraries, corporates, Local Boards, and Auckland Council. Some examples of the diverse array of groups that have entered into a Memoranda of Understanding (MOU) with the Association include Aotea Sport & Recreation Association, Auckland Normal Intermediate, Dunkirk Road Activity Centre, East Tamaki Tavern, Glen Taylor School, Gribblehirst Community Hub, Headway: Brain Injury Auckland, Kahui Tu Kaha, Orakei Bay Village, Otahuhu Pataka Korero

Library, Pakuranga Plaza shopping centre, Refugees As Survivors New Zealand, S-energy Sports Club, Tatai Hono Marae, and many others.

The Association conducted a survey of participants in the Tables in Communities project. Responses were received from 125 people and revealed the following:

- a) 100% of respondents enjoyed playing table tennis
- b) 86.4% of respondents played table tennis with someone they did not know before they met through table tennis
- c) 81.6% of respondents reported that if there was a table tennis table close to their home (within 5km) they would play table tennis more often
- d) 80% of respondents made a new friend through playing table tennis

The goals for the Tables in Communities project to be achieved by 1st December, 2021 are as follows:

- a) 15,000 players registered on the Seekapong app (currently 2,037 player registrations)
- b) 100 table tennis tables distributed in the community (92 table tennis tables purchased with 62 of those table tennis tables distributed in the community)
- c) 40 MOUs signed with Local Boards and facilities (57 MOUs signed)

Progress towards player registrations on the Seekapong app and distribution of table tennis tables in the community has been hampered by the COVID-19 pandemic and ensuing lockdowns. However, the Association continues to strive towards the identified goals for the Tables in Communities project.

Funding was received for Dinyar Irani's role from Blue Sky Community Trust, Foundation North (funding received in May 2020), Maungakiekie-Tamaki Local Board, Mt. Wellington Foundation, NZCT, Table Tennis New Zealand, and Tu Manawa Active o Aotearoa. In addition, Dinyar Irani was contracted out to North Harbour Table Tennis Association to conduct development programmes in the North Harbour region.

Funding was received for Tables in Communities project table tennis tables, bats, and balls from Albert-Eden Local Board, Four Winds Foundation, Lion Foundation, Pub Charity Limited, Trillian Trust, and Tu Manawa Active o Aotearoa. Lion Foundation provided funding as a contribution towards the cost of Seekapong app development.

During the 2021 season the Association delivered Tables in Communities project activations for Dunkirk Road Activity Centre, Glenfield Intermediate School, Mt. Eden Normal Primary School, Northcote Intermediate School, Onehunga Community Centre, Pakuranga Plaza shopping centre, Panmure Bridge School, Parnell District School, Refugees as Survivors New Zealand Youth, and Tupu Youth Library. The Association delivered a table tennis activation in Newmarket Train Station Square in conjunction with Sport Auckland over two weekends in March 2021.

The Association continued to create content and build a social media following during the 2021 season. Social media is an important avenue to promote registration on Seekapong and to create further interest in table tennis throughout the Auckland region, nationally, and internationally. As of October 2021 the Association has:

- a) Facebook account over 3,610 friends
- b) Facebook page over 2,360 likes
- c) Instagram over 770 followers
- d) WeChat Official page promotes Association activities and Seekapong
- e) You Tube channel over 220 subscribers

Rialto Cinemas Newmarket and Dominos Newmarket (pizza) continued to support the Tables in Communities project with product sponsorship. The product sponsorships form the basis of an incentives and giveaways programme to promote registrations on Seekapong and increased usage of the app.

Junior Coaching delivered at the Auckland table tennis stadium

<u>Young Explorers:</u> delivered by Eberhard Kleiser on Monday afternoons from 3.45p.m. – 4.45p.m. during the school term. Young Explorers was first introduced in 2019 to develop coordination and basic racquet skills for students aged 4 – 8 years. Participation grew to six students per session by August 2021. Continued development coaching and promotion in schools is required in order to build on the number of core attendees at Young Explorers.

<u>Day Club Under 19 training:</u> delivered by Eberhard Kleiser on Saturday afternoons from 12.30p.m. – 2.00p.m. The New Zealand Chinese Table Tennis Association oversaw the Day Club Under 19 training and collected training fees. Participation grew to 31 students per session by August 2021.

<u>Junior Club</u>: delivered by Eberhard Kleiser and Hyo Joo Lee on Thursday evenings from 5.00p.m. – 6.30p.m. Junior Club introduced students to table tennis and developed their basic table tennis skills. Junior Club ran alongside Girls' Coaching which allowed girls to progress to practice in a mixed group once they were comfortable. Participation grew to 38 students per session by August 2021.

<u>Junior Club Small Group:</u> delivered by Dinyar Irani (Tables in Communities Project Manager / Development Coach) on Thursday evenings from 5.00p.m. – 6.30p.m. and delivered by Roger Haikun Wang on Saturday afternoons from 12.30p.m. – 2.00p.m. Junior Club Small Group further developed student's basic table tennis skills and coordination to prepare those students to join Auckland representative squad training. In March 2021 the Association was pleased to extend invitations to seven graduates from Junior Club Small Group to trial with, and then join, the Auckland Intermediate B Squad.

Girls' Coaching: delivered by Hea Youn Choi and Yuchong Zhou on Thursday evenings from 5.00p.m. – 6.30p.m. The Association continued to promote Girls' Coaching through the Central Leader listings on Neighbourly and via school development coaching. Girls' Coaching was free for girls to attend with a view to encouraging greater female participation in table tennis. Once girls developed basic skills and gained confidence they progressed into the Junior Club which was a mixed group of boys and girls. Participation grew to 12 students per session by August 2021. Funding was received for Hea Youn Choi's role from Lion Foundation and Milestone Foundation.

School Holiday Coaching: Operated over the course of one week in each of the school holidays and ran from 9.00a.m. – 4.00p.m. each day of the programme. The School Holiday Coaching programme continued to attract strong attendance numbers. Students had the option of attending for a single day, multiple days, or the entire week. The Association limited the number of registrations to 80 students on any one day for health and safety considerations and in order to ensure quality of delivery. Revenue from the School Holiday Coaching programme continued to increase due to the price increase instituted in October 2020.

Dinyar Irani, Eberhard Kleiser, and Patrick Low promoted the programme directly to students in schools while conducting demonstrations, promotions, and development coaching. The Association continued to maintain a School Holiday Coaching programme contact list and promoted directly to past attendees. The programme was delivered by Dinyar Irani, Eberhard Kleiser, Hyo Joo Lee, and Patrick Low. Students aged from 5 - 16 years participated in the programme. The programme was structured to develop students' basic table tennis skills.

The programme was delivered over the course of one week (Monday – Friday) in each of the School Holidays. However, the programme scheduled to be held in October 2021 was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic and ensuing lockdowns. The number of students who attended each School Holiday Coaching was as follows:

January 2020 – 104 students (from 92 students in 2020)

April 2020 – 96 students (cancelled in 2020)

July 2020 – 93 students (from 102 students in 2020)

October 2020 – cancelled (from 97 students in 2020)

Hosting Inclusive Table Tennis (HITT) programme

The 2021 season was the 20th year the Hosting Inclusive Table Tennis (HITT) programme was run by the Association. Eberhard Kleiser was convenor, coordinator, and coach of the HITT programme for the 2021 season, and was assisted by Ivy Ho and Warwick Kitchen as required. Over 20 people volunteered their time to assist the students at the coaching sessions.

The HITT programme is a no-charge coaching programme for special needs players and ran on Tuesday mornings throughout the school year. Over 100 special needs students from six schools registered for the 2021 season. The HITT programme began on 2nd March, 2021. The programme was discontinued in August 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic and ensuing lockdowns. As a result, no Ribbon Days were held during the 2021 season.

Auckland representative squads

The Association continued delivery of the player development pathway that was first instituted fully in the 2019 season:

- a) Demonstrations, promotions, school development coaching programme, after-school clubs
- introduced players to table tennis, often for the first time
- b) Young Explorers, Junior Club, Day Club U19 Training, Girls' Coaching, and School Holiday Coaching
- introduced players to table tennis and developed their basic table tennis skills
- c) Junior Club Small Group
- further developed players' basic table tennis skills in preparation for them to join Auckland representative squad training
- d) Auckland Intermediate B Squad
- junior development squad that provided identified players with their first exposure to regular high-quality training and coaching with a view to creating established Auckland representative players
- e) Auckland Intermediate A Squad
- junior development squad that provided identified players with regular high-quality training and coaching with a view to creating established Auckland representative players
- f) Auckland Elite Squad
- junior and senior high-performance squad that provided training and coaching for established Auckland and New Zealand representative players

Auckland representative squad coaching included Auckland Elite Squad, Auckland Intermediate A Squad, and Auckland Intermediate B Squad. Wei Zhong Jiang continued as the Auckland Squad Head Coach, and Hyo Joo Lee continued as the Auckland Squad Assistant Coach. Dinyar Irani and Roger (Haikun) Wang continued as the Auckland Intermediate B Squad Coaches. Funding was received towards Wei Zhong Jiang's role from Lion Foundation, Milestone

Foundation, NZCT, and Pub Charity Limited. Funding was received towards Hyo Joo Lee's role from Four Winds Foundation, Lion Foundation, and Milestone Foundation. Funding was received towards Roger (Haikun) Wang's role from Milestone Foundation and NZCT.

Josh Alexandre, Eric (Jeong Tae) Kim, Elva (Yanlin) Li, Sherry (Kai) Peng, Dean Shu, Vicky (Fan) Yang, and Yuchong Zhou assisted as senior training partners for the Auckland Intermediate Squad. Tony Chang, Aurora Lim, James Nguyen, Shamir Salam, and George (Honggang) Zhang were included in Auckland Intermediate Squad training as senior role models.

Shane Warbrooke oversaw the player development pathway and carried out administration and communication. Dinyar Irani assisted with administration and communication to the Auckland representative squads.

Both the Auckland Intermediate A Squad and Auckland Intermediate B Squad trained three times weekly as follows:

Mondays 5.00p.m. − 7.00p.m.

Tuesdays 5.00p.m. -7.00p.m.

Sundays 12.45p.m. – 2.45p.m.

The Auckland Elite Squad trained two times weekly as follows:

Tuesdays 7.00p.m. – 9.00p.m.

Sundays: 3.00p.m. – 6.00p.m.

Two qualification tournaments were held for Auckland Intermediate Squad players throughout the season. One qualification tournament was held for Auckland Elite Squad players throughout the season.

The first Auckland Intermediate Squad qualification tournament (in March 2021) determined six players to be promoted from Auckland Intermediate A Squad to Auckland Elite Squad, and three players to be promoted from Auckland Intermediate B Squad to Auckland Intermediate A Squad.

In March 2021 the Association was pleased to extend invitations to seven graduates from Junior Club Small Group to trial with, and then join, the Auckland Intermediate B Squad.

The second Auckland Intermediate Squad qualification tournament (in August 2021) determined two players to be promoted from Auckland Intermediate A Squad to Auckland Elite Squad, and four players to be promoted from Auckland Intermediate B Squad to Auckland Intermediate A Squad. In addition, the results were used to assist in selecting Auckland representative teams to compete in the 2021 New Zealand Open Table Tennis Championships.

The results of the first Auckland Elite Squad qualification tournament (in August 2021) were used to assist in selecting Auckland representative teams to compete in the 2021 New Zealand Open Table Tennis Championships.

The Association continued to implement selection criteria to deem players eligible for selection in Auckland representative teams to compete at the 2021 New Zealand Open Table Tennis Championships. The selection criteria applied to the Open Men's A team, Open Men's B team, Open Women's A team, Open Women's B team, and all junior teams. Selection criteria was as follows:

- attend 50% of squad training
- enter the Auckland Summer Open, ANZAC Open, Auckland Junior Open (for players under the age of 18 years), and Auckland Open unless there was a viable excuse
- enter a team in Auckland Winter Interclub and compete in at least 50% of Interclub fixtures unless there was a viable excuse

However, The Victor 2021 Auckland Open was postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic and ensuing lockdowns, and the 2021 New Zealand Open Table Tennis Championships were cancelled.

By the end of the 2020 / 2021 financial year there were 14 players enrolled in the Auckland Intermediate B Squad, 13 players enrolled in the Auckland Intermediate A Squad, and 24 players enrolled in the Auckland Elite Squad. All players over the age of 18 years were exempt from paying squad coaching fees. The Association continues to identify and develop coaching talent from within the Auckland table tennis community through the pathway of training partner to coach.

Administration support, Competitions Manager & Funding Officer

Hongbing (Peter) Wu was employed as Stadium Administrator from late April 2021 onwards. In addition to stadium administration, Peter was effective in promoting stadium keyholder memberships and generating event sponsorship.

Kelly Wu and Ying Ma provided administration support for the Association on Saturdays and Sundays.

David Jackson was contracted as Competitions Manager for the Association. David Jackson was responsible for Tournaments, Interclub, and School competitions and events and worked in conjunction with Dinyar Irani, Eberhard Kleiser, and Shane Warbrooke. Funding was received for David Jackson's role from Blue Waters Community Trust and NZCT.

Cliff Freeman continued to be contracted to provide funding services for the Association to great success.

Stadium hire

The Summit Chess Club continued to hire the upstairs lounge at the Auckland table tennis stadium on a regular basis. The Club provided chess coaching on Wednesdays, a chess club on Fridays, and monthly chess tournaments on one Sunday each month. The Club did not operate during COVID-19 Alert Level 3 or Alert Level 4 lockdown.

Manukau Institute of Technology offered free English courses at the Auckland table tennis stadium that began in February 2021 and ran twice a week on Wednesdays and Thursdays. The courses were aimed at English for everyday life. The courses did not run during the School Holidays. The courses were discontinued in August 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Association ended its relationship with Arts & Play Therapy in Education Trust (APTE) in March 2021. APTE previously hired the Presidents Lounge at the Auckland table tennis stadium for office space and storage. The Association repurposed the Presidents Lounge for office space and storage of table tennis equipment.

The Association ended its relationship with Direct Detoxification System (DDS) massage in March 2021. DDS Massage was a sponsor of the Association. Mansfield Lam previously delivered DDS massage from the Racket Control Room at the Auckland table tennis stadium. The Association repurposed the Racket Control Room for storage of table tennis equipment, particularly table tennis tables.

Stadium maintenance

Nick Ning (general stadium maintenance), and Virginia Waters (gardening and landscaping) continued to volunteer their time to the Association to ensure that the Auckland table tennis stadium was well maintained.

The Association conducted fortnightly Risk Assessment checks on the Auckland table tennis stadium and continued to contract the services of Safety Online who provided Health & Safety Management Software to assist the Association in meeting Health & Safety requirements. The Association continued to utilise the Hello Club stadium member management and access control system. The Association maintains an annual subscription for a Premium Plan and hardware integration.

The Association changed cleaning contractor from Cleancorp to Consistence Quality in March 2021. The Association increased the frequency of cleaning to five days per week (previously four days per week).

Funding was received from Milestone Foundation to replace the Association's photocopier in March 2021. The Association purchased a used photocopier outright and entered into a service agreement with Ricoh.

The Association arranged for ACM Removals to remove and dispose of Super Six sheets from the rear of the Auckland table tennis stadium in April 2021. The pickup also included a grid pick of all visible pieces of Super Six. The Association arranged for CIS Group to clean the gutters leading off the Super Six roof above the upstairs cafeteria in June 2021. The Association arranged for Total Seal Roofing Waterproofing to repair leaks in the Super Six roof above the upstairs cafeteria by encapsulating it with Rustoleum Noxyde in August 2021.

Funding was received from Lion Foundation for a roof wash and treatment, gutter cleaning, Fire Exits wash and treatment, and partial commercial building wash. Work was confined to the Color Steel roof and gutters, and cement board building exterior. The work was conducted by New Zealand Treatments and Spraying in July 2021.

Funding was received from Blue Sky Community Trust, Grassroots Trust, and TAB NZ to replace twelve Butterfly Centrefold Rollaway table tennis tables on the Auckland table tennis stadium floor. The Association intends to replace the remaining nine used Butterfly Centrefold Rollaway table tennis tables on the Auckland table tennis stadium floor during the 2021 / 2022 season.

Sponsorship

<u>Commute Transportation Consultants</u> provided sponsorship of \$3,000 to the Association for the 2021 season. The funds were targeted towards the continuation of the Commute ATTA Elite Player Scholarships for the 2021 season. The 2021 season was the third year in which Commute Transportation Consultants were associated with the scholarships.

The 2021 international season was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Traditionally the scholarships assisted elite players with costs associated with attending international table tennis events. The Association adjusted the criteria for the 2021 Commute Transportation Consultants ATTA Elite Player Scholarships several times due to the cancellation of the 2021 Oceania Championships, the postponement of the 2021 Auckland Open, and the cancellation of the 2021 NZ Open Table Tennis Championships. As a result, at the time of writing the Scholarships have not been awarded.

<u>Penberthy Insurance</u> provided sponsorship of \$1,725 for the Association for the 2020 / 2021 season. These funds helped to support the Association's development and promotional activities, and general stadium maintenance

PRIZM DataTech PayPlus provided sponsorship of \$2,000 for the Association for the 2020 / 2021 season. These funds helped to support the Association's development and promotional activities, and general stadium maintenance

Ray White Real Estate – Sandringham provided sponsorship of \$2,000 for the Association for the 2020 / 2021 season. These funds helped to support the Association's development and promotional activities, and general stadium maintenance

<u>The Gateau House</u> provided sponsorship of \$2,000 for the Association for the 2020 / 2021 season. These funds helped to support the Association's development and promotional activities, and general stadium maintenance

Treasurer's Report Year Ending 31st August 2021

It is my pleasure to present this Financial Report as Treasurer of the Auckland Table Tennis Association (Inc).

You are referred to the Accounts enclosed in this Annual Report.

The Association had an excess of Income over Expenditure for the year of \$42,676. This compares to last year's result of an excess of Income over Expenditure of \$6,522.

The Statement of Financial Performance shows the impact of the (partial) return to a normal operating environment. Of particular note is the increasing impact of Coaching and School Holiday Camps as the Association accommodates everincreasing numbers of attendees and re-aligns its coach charging regime to a more-marketed approach. In addition, Stadium Memberships and Trust income remain significant contributors to the Association's income. The operational costs of the Association are dominated by the salaries and associated costs of its 4 salaried staff and by stadium-related costs and the Tables in Communities initiative.

The Statement of Financial Position shows that the Association remains in a healthy financial state with significant funds-although the impact of the current lockdown will make some inroads into this position.

AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF THE AUCKLAND TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION (Inc.)

Responsibilities of the Management Committee

The Management Committee is responsible for the preparation of Financial Statements, which fairly reflects the financial position of the Association as at 31 August 2021 and of the results of their operations for the year ended on that date.

Auditor's responsibilities

It is my responsibility to express an independent opinion on the Financial Statements presented by the Management Committee and report my opinion to you. As I am not a member of the Management Committee nor am I involved in the day-to-day activities of the Association I believe that I am able to give an independent opinion.

Basis of Opinion

An audit includes examining on a test basis, evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the Financial Statements. It also includes assessing:

- The significant estimates and judgements made by the elected officers in the preparation of the Financial Statements, and
- Whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the Association's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

I conducted my audit in accordance with generally accepted New Zealand auditing standards, except that my work was limited as explained below. I planned and performed my audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which I considered necessary in order to provide me with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the Financial Statements are free from material misstatements, whether caused by fraud or error. In forming my opinion I have also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the Financial Statements.

Qualified Opinion

In common with organizations of a similar nature, a portion of the Association's recorded income is from cash sources and there is limited control over this income prior to its being recorded. There are no practical audit procedures to determine the effect of this limited control.

In my opinion, subject to the possible effect of the limited control referred to in the preceding paragraph, the accompanying Financial Statements reflect the financial position of the Association as at 31 August 2021 and the results of its operations for the year ended on that date.

My audit report was completed on 29th October 2021 and my qualified opinion is expressed as at that date.

Notes to the Accounts for the Year Ended 31 August 2021

1. Basis of Preparation:

- a) The general principles as recommended by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of New Zealand for the measurement and reporting of results and Financial Position under the historical cost method have been used in the preparation of these Accounts. As the Association is not a Registered Charity the Management Committee has elected not to apply PBE Simple Format Reporting Standard-Account to these Accounts.
- b) Fixed Assets: Depreciation has been provided on Stadium, Office, Canteen and Playing (Tables) Equipment and Security Systems at 20% of the Book Value ruling at the start of the year and purchases (less sales) for the year.
- c) Inventories are valued at the lower of cost or net realizable value.
- d) The Accounts have been prepared on a GST inclusive basis.
- e) There have been no material changes in Accounting Policy for the year.
- 2. Grants: During the year the following grants were received:
- a) Commute Transportation Consultants: \$3,000. Contribution to the Commute ATTA Elite Player Scholarships. \$3,000 carried forward to 2021/2022.
